# Snow Advisory from the Harding Township Committee

The Harding Township Department of Public Works (DPW) does an excellent job each winter season to maintain Township roads safe for travel. The DPW works long hours to plow and sand the roads during each snow and ice storm. Residents are reminded that they should avoid parking cars on Township roads during snow and ice storms. Any such parked cars impede the efficient clearing of roads and provide a serious hazard for the DPW as well as for other motorists. In addition, residents should advise those private contractors who may plow their driveways not to dump snow from the driveways into the Township roads. The plowed snow should be pushed completely to the shoulders of the roads. Driveway snow piles left on Township roads present serious traffic hazards.

<u>The Harding Twp Police Department</u>, Chief Kevin J. Gaffney, offers the following tips on Weathering A Winter Storm: Store drinking water, a first aid kit, canned/no-cook food, a non-electric can opener, radio, flashlight and extra batteries where you can get them easily, especially in the dark. Keep cars and other vehicles fueled and in good repair, with a winter emergency kit in each. Winterize your house, barn, shed or any other structure that may provide shelter for your family, neighbors, animals, or equipment.

The Township reminds residents that all dog licenses are subject to renewal during January. In accordance with state law, no license will be issued without written proof of rabies vaccination. Fee is \$9.70, \$3 additional for unspayed/unneutered. A late fee after March 1 is an additional \$5. Funds from the dog licensing program are used to finance the Township's annual rabies vaccination clinic, held in the fall each year. A dog census will be conducted in spring/summer 2003.

School Board, December 9 and 16, 2002

School officials voted to appropriate nearly \$26,000 for emergency asbestos abatement and monitoring at the school building on Lee's Hill Rd at the Dec 16 meeting. Insulation, which had been wrapped around a pipe in a mechanical pit beneath a hall in the middle school, was discovered to have fallen off a pipe. The work was done during Christmas break.

# 2003-2004 Budget - Fixed Costs

Board Member Robert Mathews reported that each Board committee reviewed the fixed costs in their areas and he provided a summary. The fixed costs for personnel include salaries, increased by 4.5% as per the negotiated contract, and benefits. The Board was able to control the increases in benefits by increasing the prescription drug co-payment, capping the dental contribution, and establishing the PPO as the base plan. Tuition costs include special education placements as well as Madison High School students. Transportation costs include the seven elementary and two high school public routes, private school routes, special education routes and aid-in-lieu payments. Buildings and grounds fixed costs include maintenance agreements for various systems, such as fire alarm, HVAC controls, phone equipment, copier machines, elevator and lifts, etc. Mr. Mathews reported that fixed costs for the 2003-2004 school year are projected to be approximately \$5.8 million of an approximately \$7 million budget.

The Board appointed the following community members to the 2003-2004 Budget Advisory Committee: Sally Dudley, Epsey Farrell, Jim Mueller, and Candace Weeks.
