TOWNSHIP NEWS

Township Committee

The Township Committee is considering charging new home owners a 1 percent development fee to fund an estimated \$2 million affordable

housing plan, said Planning Consultant Susan C. Kimball. A proposed ordinance, which was discussed on Wednesday, Jan. 19, would help fund construction of 24-units of low- and moderate-income housing at the intersection of Kitchell and Woodland roads, scheduled for construction this fall. Kimball said the typical new Harding home costs \$2 million to build, excluding the cost of the land. She said a development fee of 1 percent would raise \$20,000 for new construction.

“There would be no fees on existing homes,” said Township Committeeman Louis Lanzerotti, “This will have no impact on existing residents, unless they decide to build a brand new home.” The proposed ordinance was not introduced at the Wednesday, Jan. 19, committee meeting, because officials couldn’t decide on the finer details.

Under a rule of the state Council on Affordable Housing, (COAH) municipalities can charge development fees of 1 percent for new construction and 2 percent for commercial construction, Kimball said. Under recent COAH guidelines, for every eight market homes constructed, a township has to build one affordable housing unit, said E.J. Miranda, a spokesman for the Department of Community Affairs. Harding Township averages about 10 new homes a year, Kimball said. For every 25 jobs created in a town, measured by new or expanded commercial construction, another affordable housing unit also is required under the new guidelines, Miranda said.

The township is also considering imposing a 2 percent development fee on commercial properties that involve new construction or improvement on a new building. Both the construction and the residential development fees would be based on assessed values. As an example, the fee for a small new business assessed at \$1.5 million, would be 2 percent, or \$30,000, Kimball said. Since less than 1 percent of Harding’s land is zoned commercially, and most lots are already built out, few fees are expected from commercial development, Kimball said.

The planned new housing meets a previous COAH requirement that required Harding Township to have 88 affordable housing units, Miranda said. Harding Township transferred 43 units to the city of Orange, fulfilling the rest of the 88-unit obligation, said Miranda. To transfer the 43 units of obligation, Harding paid Orange \$860,000 or \$20,000 a unit, Miranda said. The preliminary cost for the proposed affordable housing apartments on Kitchell and Woodland roads was originally estimated at \$1.7 million, but it could go as high as \$2 million, Kimball said.

Typically, COAH allows towns to charge development fees, which are

placed in an escrow fund to be used for housing rehabilitation. Those who qualify for the low-income housing could make a maximum of \$32,000 a year and moderate housing would be available for residents who make \$51,000, Murray said. Engineering consultant Paul Ferriero said the proposed development would have five one-bedroom apartments, 14 two-bedrooms and five three bedrooms. A single bedroom apartment would be 650 square-feet, two bedroom units would be 985 square-feet and a three-bedroom unit would be 1,208 square-feet, Ferriero said. There would be no basement for the affordable housing units because of the water table. A wetland area led planners to require a 150-foot buffer zone along the western area of the property. The development will be located on the northeast portion of the 8.3-acre site, facing Woodland Road.

PLANNING BOARD, January 24, 2005

There was discussion relating to the approval of the Township application for the affordable housing project. The Mayor argued for approval of the application (#5-99), in order for the building project to commence ASAP. The COAH regulations apparently recently changed, in December 2004, and Township officials need to build the units by the end of 2005 in order to meet the previously agreed-upon COAH requirements for the town, (see above discussion also relating to this matter). Although the Township has committed to comply with all environmental regulations applying to this site, the waiver of the Environmental Commission was necessary to pass the application on 1/24/05.

Application, 4-04, was heard for Kay Lyall, owner, and Kaplan, builders, on the revised plans for her property of 26 acres, "The Ridge at Sand Spring". In November this had been a 3-acre, 6-lot, conforming subdivision, no variances, but due to changes in the minimum zoning laws, now is a 5-lot subdivision, with an average size of 5 acres. The biggest lot is closest to Sand Spring Rd having 8 acres, another lot is 5+ acres, and the remaining 3 lots are about 4 acres each. The present application requires a design waiver to permit a access road of more than 12% grade, which would stay on the westerly edge of the property, instead of going across the hillside.

Application 10-04, Carey, Van Buren Rd, for 3-lot subdivision, one with existing house, two building lots, all comply with current 5-acre minimum zone, was also heard.
