TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE

Township Committee Meeting – February 18, 2014

All Committee members present

Minutes were approved December and January meetings.

There was discussion of the tennis courts. Gail McKane stated the Joint Insurance Fund has strongly suggested the tennis courts be repaired or closed. There will be continued discussion of the courts.

Introduction of **Ordinance TC 02-14** – CPI Ordinance was presented. This would allow the municipal budget to be increased to a maximum of 3.5%. This must be approved every year before the budget.

Public Hearing – **Ordinance TC 01-14** – Revising Fee Schedule - Some fees will be adjusted downward and a few sub categories will be added and or refined such as Rules for Abandonment of Tanks.

Resolution – **TC14-043** – Escrow Release Five Technical reviews and one grading

TC 14-044 – Confirm Tax Grace Period – The tax grace period was extended until February 24, 2014 due to inclement weather and closing of the municipal building.

TC14-045 – Bill List – February

There was discussion regarding management of The Farm with regard to the management company T2 Construction and coordination of materials and supplies. Ms. McKane stated the housing units are going on five years old and there will be increased maintenance costs. This will be presented in more detail during the final budget presentation.

TC14-046 – Award Contract – Corporate Benefit Solutions (Insurance Broker)

TC14-047 – Extension of 151 Madison Avenue Bond

Continued Preliminary Budget Presentation

The 2014 Budget will be presented in final form at the next meeting. Discussion began with the increase in snow removal costs and the incredible demands made on DPW personnel throughout this challenging winter.

Health insurance costs were lowered \$168,000. The specifics of the changes were not discussed but changes were recommended for the administration staff as of January 1, 2014 including continuing contributions for the fourth year. The PBA contract was not discussed but contributions from participants will be made to healthcare costs for the second year.

FEMA reimbursement continues to be discussed as 50% of 75% of expenses have been submitted. To date the Township has received \$146,878. It's unknown when or if more funds will be received.

Harding Open Space Trust Presentation: February 18, 2014

Larry Weppler presented the budget for HOST. 160 acres have been preserved including the most recent 43 acres along James Street. There has been analysis of properties with 10+ acres and HOST believes there will be additional properties meeting criteria of:

- Viewscape, visibility to public and gateway
- · Linkages to other preserved properties
- Water resource protection value
- Other environmental resource protection
- Public access, equestrian trails, hiking
- Funding options and availability of funds
- Likelihood of development

The prospect of purchasing Lot 4.03 adjacent to the recently acquired 4.02 property was discussed. This included management of the two lots as one

property with regard to mowing. It was proposed that both the Township and HOST would have one year's notice to dissolve the maintenance agreement.

HARDING TOWNSHIP BOARD OF EDUCATION

Highlights - Board of Education Meeting Monday, January, 20, 2014
The main item of tonight's business was the presentation of the Preliminary Budget" by Dr. Anemone, which was a forecast of the challenges and a timeline for budget approval. Although no change in the staffing level is projected, funding requirements may change as a result of the contract negotiations, which will begin shortly. Health care, under the "Affordable Care Act" will certainly be less affordable than it is now, with an increase that could account for 1% of the school budget alone! There is a surplus carryover of \$233k, and the expectation of \$225K of state aid (same as last two years), but that is never a certainty. As much preparation as possible is being done now in advance of the state aid figures being released at the end of February so that a tentative budget can be discussed at the March 3

Board Meeting. This is the one to watch, where what little action is possible within the tightly constrained budget will take place. After that date, it is all

pretty much all pro forma, being sent to the County for approval, and then back to us for a March 24th Public Hearing (of what already has been done). This presentation is posted on the Harding School website and is well worth a look.

Mr. Spelker, School Principal, presented his implementation of a "Differentiated Learning Plan" with the goal of assisting teachers to help students in the classroom who perform at various levels each to maximize their learning opportunity – some students get helped up and more advanced ones are challenged with more enterprising tasks. This initiative seems well received by all.

Highlights - <u>Board of Education Meeting</u> Monday, February 10, 2014 This meeting was rescheduled from February 3rd which was cancelled due to snow.

The Superintendent gave the semi-annual EVVRS and HIB Report as required by the State. For those of us who don't know, EVVRS is the "Electronic Violence and Vandalism Reporting System" and is basically a report of how the school keeps the students safe. Also, the status of the HIB (harassment, intimidation, and bullying) program was reviewed. Five reports were investigated for the first half of this school year, validating one HIB incident. If the trend continues, it will be a significant improvement from years past. For a closer look at all this, visit the school's website for the full presentation.

The Principal reported on his "Harding Academy" initiative as an effort to improve test-taking ability. This will be a <u>voluntary</u>, once per week, after school activity available for 4, 5, & 6 grade students for three weeks in April, just prior to the state-wide tests. It is based on his previous experience, and it is expected that perhaps 25 or more students will want to take part.

It was reported that on Friday, February 7th, a successful and enthusiastic Science Fair was held at the school involving about 50 students. It was anticipated that an *Observer Tribune* article covering the event would appear, so hopefully it has been noticed by everyone by the time this *Thumbnail* reaches your mailbox. In any case, you should still be able to read all about the Science Fair on the Harding School District Website.

As reported last month, it is anticipated that the tentative 2014/15 school budget can be discussed at the **March 3 Board Meeting.** The date for the formal budget presentation has been changed, however, from March 24th to May 5th, as a result of the new law moving the school budget to the November ballot instead of June as in former times. (Remember that you won't even see the budget on the ballot unless it exceeds the 2% cap!)

Speaking of money, the Board did pass a resolution to formally petition the State for reimbursement to fund recent state-mandated programs costing – to date, over \$73,000 and continuing!

February 17th BOE meeting has been rescheduled for February 24th, highlights will appear in Aprils *Thumbnail*.

(Note: the purpose of this brief report is to help Harding residents connect with the School by highlighting significant items addressed by the Board. The "meeting minutes" are filed by the Board Secretary and placed on the Harding School website for all to view, generally about a month after the meeting date.)

PLANNING BOARD

Planning Board Meeting January 27, 2014

<u>Declaration of Appointments by the Township Committee</u>: Pending the election of officers, the meeting was called to order by Mr. Hall. He announced the appointments to the Board of Richard Clew for a three-year term (Class II) and Tim Jones for a one-year term (Alternate). Nanette

DiTosto, Alf Newlin and Joe Schliefer were reappointed for one-year terms. The oath was administered to the appointees who were present.

Roll Call: Messrs. dePoortere and Newlin, and Ms. DiTosto absent.

2014 Reorganization

- Mr. Saulnier was unanimously elected Chairman. The meeting was turned over to Mr. Saulnier, and Ms. Olcott was unanimously elected Vice-Chairman.
- The resolution (01-14) for professional services (to be provided by Messrs. Drew, Fox and Hall) was unanimously approved. Mr. Fox was sworn in; Mr. Drew was absent.
- The resolution (02-14) to set the meeting dates for 2013 was unanimously approved.

<u>Minutes</u>: The minutes of the meetings on October 28, 2013 and November 18, 2013 were approved after some comments and revisions. The minutes of the site visit to the Lang property on December 7, 2013 were also approved.

Announcements/Reports/Presentations

- Ms. Olcott presented some statistics on Harding from a county municipal demographics report (#1 median home value of \$1MM+, #2 median household income of \$165K, and in the top 5 of education attainment with 76% of population with at least a bachelor's degree).
- Mr. Dietz reported that the Water and Environmental Committee will be looking at storm water management.
- Mr. Schliefer reported minimal activity at the Board of Adjustment with one case involving coverage.
- Mr. Clew reported that the Environmental Commission had held its reorganization meeting and that 2014 priorities were being set.

Application

PB 04-13, **Applicant Wesley and Mary Margaret Lang**, Block 19, Lot 7, 521 James Street, Minor Subdivision Approval. Action: Continue Public Hearing. This is a property of over 12 acres with two proposed lots that conform to size requirements. Lot 7.03 (5.44 acres) has been created as a

flag lot at back of property with a drive to serve it. Lot 7 will be 7 acres. Everything conforms to zoning requirements except playhouse about 40 feet from property line. A swing set will be removed and play house will be retained. There will be an easement to allow new drive to avoid trees along property line. A 30K gallon cistern was installed at end of the flag staff, and there is a storm water management plan to deal with new drive. New house shown on plan is currently conceptual. The bridle path easement was widened to 25 feet along southern line and line in back (along perimeter), and there will be landscaping along uphill side of driveway. Mr. Fox then reviewed his report which included several issues. The driveway needs to be realigned to reduce the grade and include spacing requirement for passing zones.

Additional space is needed at the entrance and the apron needs to be paved. With respect to the storm water management plan, the infiltration trench needs to be redesigned for storage, it should show run off will not affect neighbor's property, trenches need to drain in 72 hours, and a maintenance manual must be developed for the owner. With respect to the bridle trail in the row of trees along the southern line, sufficient width must be provided given gravel in infiltration trench.

The Board discussed whether a resolution should be drafted. The inclination of the Board was to approve the application if all conditions were met, so Ms. Olcott moved that a resolution be prepared for review at the next meeting. This was approved and the matter was carried to the meeting on February 24, 2014.

Other Business

- 2014 Planning Board Budget: Mr. Saulnier presented a draft budget for discussion. He will revise and get to Gail McKane. The final budget will be introduced in March and approved in April.
- 2014 Goals and Initiatives: As a carryover from 2013, Mr. Saulnier suggested a review of land use and environmental ordinances that could be causing hardships for property owners, as well as ordinances that might tighten requirements for property owners. A list of such ordinances will be discussed at the February meeting.

Meeting adjourned.

Wildlife Management Committee

<u>Bears:</u> The WMC reminds all that the award winning DVD "Living with NJ Black Bears" is available for loan at the Kemmerer Library. <u>Canada Geese:</u> In its efforts to control the Canada geese population in Harding Township, the Wildlife_Management Committee is asking residents to help identify locations where Canada geese might be nesting in the Township. Volunteers are ready to assist by treating eggs so that they will not hatch (called addling), using methods approved by the Fish & Wildlife Service.

If you have a body of water on or near your property, or have seen goslings in prior years, it is likely that you will have nests again this year. Harassing birds during the nesting season, or removing eggs from nests is counterproductive, because it will encourage the birds to re-nest out of sight, where eggs can't be found or effectively treated.

Early identification of bird pairs and nesting sites does much to assure the process. Migratory geese will leave the area by the end of March. Resident bird pairs will then be more visible, usually claiming an area and keeping other pairs away. If you think your property is a potential nesting site, if you see obvious pairs, would like to learn more about what to look for or need help in spotting or treating nests, please contact the Committee at khmeister3@gmail.com, (973) 605 8274 or r.a.shields@att.net, (973) 267-5673.) A property conducive to nesting should be monitored weekly throughout the nesting season, which starts in mid to late March and ends mid May. For help and best results, please call us sooner rather than later. Addling eggs controls the growth of the goose population. Done properly, it is both, humane and effective!
