EVERYTHING YOU WANT TO KNOW ABOUT ELECTRIC POWER OUTAGES IN HARDING

Storm season is upon us. In the aftermath of a storm, have you ever wanted to know...

- Why do I have cable service but no electricity?
- Why does my neighbor have power, but I don't?
- If I don't see sparks, can I just go chainsaw the tree that took down the wires?
- Why does it take so darn long to restore power?

You can get answers to these questions and many more on Tuesday, September 18, at 7:30PM at Kirby Hall.

Robert Walton, JCP&L Area Manager, will make a comprehensive presentation about how

electricity is delivered to our homes and how the utilities recover after storm damage. He is prepared to answer all our questions about electric power service.

This event is being jointly sponsored by the Harding Township Civic Association and Kemmerer Library Harding Township.

PLANNING BOARD

At its meeting on May 21st, the Board approved a resolution for Application PB 01-18 for 18 Griffin Lane subject to clarifying the height and receiving Board of Health approvals. The Board approved the revision of ordinance TC-10-2018 (amendment to the terms "story" and "story and a half") for consistency with the Master Plan. The Board also approved the draft ordinance TC-11-2018 (zoning permit requirements) for consistency with the Master Plan. Mr. Clew reported that the Advisory Review Committee had met to discuss the exemption for building area for accessory structures that contribute to rural character, and possible changes to address the issue. Mr. Clew also reported the Environmental Commission is reviewing the hunting policy and is soliciting feedback on the policy. Mr. Modi reported that the First Aid Squad is down to 23 members and is looking for additional volunteers. There was a discussion about the memo from Historic Preservation regarding Floor Area Ratio; there will be further discussion at a future meeting with the Planner.

Of particular interest at the meeting on June 25th was a discussion of a proposed Township ordinance meant to deal with the advent of small cell equipment or "nodes" which are being developed in connection with new 5G cell phone technology. These nodes would require poles 100 feet apart which raises a number of issues, such as use of current poles (and permissions required), placement of poles where no poles currently exist, impact of poles on rural character, and so on. The Board agreed to send the Township Committee a memo that the requirements of the technology were inconsistent with the master plan, that the impact of the increase in poles and equipment will negatively impacted the rural character, that public lands should excluded from the technology, and the distance between needed poles should be maximized.

At the July 23rd meeting, the Board approved a six-month extension for Application PB 04-16 for the property at 61 Village Road. Marketing has proved difficult and the county requirements for access have dragged out the process. Mr. Saulnier reported receiving a memo from the Planner regarding R-3 zoning which will be discussed next month. Mr. Schliefer reported that a new plan for the townhouses at Post House Road will be submitted to the Board of Adjustment in August. Mr. Modi reported that the Township Committee had approved an ordinance creating a zone which will allow Mt. Kemble Associates to construct 96 town home units on a 15-acre vacant parcel along Route 202. Eighty units will be 'fair market value" and sixteen will be set aside as low income housing. The agreement will avoid a builder's remedy lawsuit where the builder could have sued to build even more homes in connection with the ongoing housing fair share controversy.

ASH TREE REMOVAL

JCP&L Aggressive removal of Ash Trees near power lines

The Township has been advised by JCP&L that they are planning on removing all ash trees that pose a threat to their transmission and distribution lines. Trees proposed for removal will be marked with a short strip of pink ribbon stapled to each tree. Adjacent property owners will be notified prior to the removals. I advised JCP&L that ash trees on Township Property that have been tagged with aluminum dog tags have been injected to protect against EAB attack.

ADDITIONAL POLICE OFFICER SWORN IN

At the July Township Committee meeting, Mr. Matthew Hart was sworn in. Hart has a bachelor's degree from Essex County College of Public Safety. He is now a full time officer with our police department on the usual one year probationary period - annual salary is \$45,219.

The Harding police department has 12 full time officers including the chief and two special police officers.

GEESE PATROL RECOGNIZED FOR VOLUNTEER SERVICE

Twelve volunteers were recognized for their service on the Geese Patrol. The Geese Patrol monitors the Bayne Park and nearby properties for wild geese and uses state of the art techniques to prevent them from taking up residence. The 12 individuals are Christine Katz, Stacey Hollenbeck, Richard Clew, Mare Olsen, Nancy Barrett, Larry Weppler, Roberta Shields, Tracy Waddelow, Pat Posen, Melissa Simon, Gwenn Claytor and Leslie Marchese.

TOWNHOUSE ZONE CREATED FOR MT KEMBLE ROAD PROJECT

Another hurdle was cleared for the development by Mt Kemble Associates of the townhouse project on Mt Kemble Road behind the old AT&T Long Lines facility. A special zone for the project was created and approved for the project which will include a number of COAH units.

ROLLING HILLS LANDFILL SUPERFUND SITE

The Rolling Knolls Landfill site is located in Green Village (aka Chatham) on Brittain Road. The nearly 200-acre area was used as an unlined landfill for just over 30 years. The privately-owned landfill, which closed in 1968, received solid waste from various parties and this waste included construction and demolition debris, household refuse and scrap metal. Landfill operations contaminated soil, sediment, surface water and groundwater with metals, polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), pesticides, Freon compounds and volatile and semi-volatile organic compounds (VOCs). It was designated a Superfund site, eligible for federal funds for clean-up.

The plan is for the massive amount of material to be trucked from the site and dumped in better site. A number of parties including the US Fish and Wildlife Service, the Highlands, and Great Swamp Watershed Association want the site to be remediated in-situ so as not have trucks driving in and out of the site for months, possibly years. The TC was asked to join the

petition to have the remediation plan changed.

BAMBOO ORDINANCE AND MARIJUANA ORDINANCE BEING DRAFTED

The bamboo ordinance is expected to cover the property owner's responsibility to control a species of this plant from invading neighbors' property. The marijuana ordinance which will be similar to ordinances in neighboring towns will control production and sale of marijuana should it become legal in the state.

Presentation: How to Measure Natural Land Health in Harding Township

When: Wednesday, September 26th, from 7 to 8:30 PM

Where: Harding Township Municipal Building, 21 Blue Mill Road, New Vernon NJ 07976 Join Dr. Emile DeVito and the Harding Township Environmental Commission to learn about: The importance of the food web for pollinators, birds, and other local wildlife provided by native trees and plants

How to recognize healthy vs. unhealthy forest / understory floral layers How to scientifically assess natural land health including on your own property The relative health of two beautiful Harding open space properties based on a recent assessment. One is open to deer and the other is closed to deer.

The Environmental Commission held a public hearing on the Deer Hunting Policy in June and issued recommendations to the Township Committee in August. The EC recommended improvements in hunting maps and notices posted on Town properties and a ban on the use of Drones for hunting purposes. A recommendation to allow hunting on Sundays was also made, but additional permissions will be required from the State of New Jersey before this can be implemented. This change and further consideration of the use of baiting will be reviewed prior to the 2019 hunting season.

The New Jersey Department of Agriculture has identified defoliation caused by the gypsy moth in Harding Township. Gypsy moths feed on and severely defoliate many species of trees in forested areas. Heavy infestations can lead to tree loss. They will be conducting gypsy moth egg mass surveys in the fall to determine the extent of the infestation and make recommendations on treatment.
