HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

This year's Historic House of the Year will be announced at the June Township Committee Meeting.

2020 Historic House of The Year

The HPC of Harding Township would like to recognize a historic residence - renovated or maintained - that adds aesthetic value and interest to our rural streetscapes.

Historic districts recognize architectural importance of commercial buildings and residences all across the nation and preserve the character and identity of the towns in which they are located.

Historic House of the Year will be a chance for us to highlight a property that enhances the historical character in Harding Township.

Specific Requirements:

- The home we wish to highlight should be viewed from the road and enhance streetscape.
- Display proper use of materials including but not limited to: exterior sheathing, trim, windows, roof style, and colors.
- Architectural style that complements the rural character of the Township.
- Landscaping and lighting that are indigenous to the geographical area.

TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE

At Township Committee: Photo Contest, Glen Alpin and Hurstmont

At the regular May meeting, the TC covered three topics, but the Redevelopment Plan for the Hurstmont property dominated.

Photo Finish: The TC appeared to approve (though there was no formal vote or a counting of hands) a joint request from the Historical Society, Library, and Land Trust to display photographs of the winners of the annual children's photography contest. The display area would be on the second floor of Kirby Hall outside the township administrator's office for 7 months after the photos (framed and matted) had been displayed in Kemmerer Library for 5 months.

Glen Alpin Passes Milestone: The Township submitted its application for diversion of Glen Alpin. "Diversion" is the confusingly named process by which Harding hopes to be able to sell Glen Alpin. The process requires the Township to acquire more acreage (multiple of the area of GA) as compensation for selling GA, which was purchased using substantial State and County funds. But since Harding regularly purchases land for preservation, the idea is that diversion "leverages" our open space purchases to put Glen Alpin in strong hands that has the resources to preserve it. The new owner would have to honor legal requirements (aka "easements"- another confusing term) that call for maintaining the unique antique structure. The Township hopes that our diversion application will be approved this year - as at least one former mayor said, "The wheels of government turn slowly."

Hurstmont Redevelopment Plan Adopted and Made Public: Hurstmont is the site of a deteriorated mansion on Rt202 just north of Glen Alpin. Harding's approved plan to meet New Jersey Fair Housing demands calls for redevelopment of the site by a private entity into facility for assisted living and elderly nursing care. The document describing the plan was to be posted on the Township website immediately after adoption. The presentation by planner Susan Gruel said the all the concerns voiced by the public were addressed by the plan. She listed almost 20 areas of concern and described how the Plan speaks to them. The public's concerns were such things as traffic (plan requires study of needed infrastructure and traffic), storm water runoff (plan required to consider), trails (plan requires public trails to Glen Alpin and Jockey Hollow), etc. The project now moves to the Planning Board meeting in June where there will be a public hearing. Interested parties were encouraged to read the plan first.

Open Space Trust Committee Ordinance: Ch...Ch...Ch...Changes: The ordinance that defines the operation of the Open Space Trust Committee has been revised. Most importantly the OS Trust Committee is now required to submit an annual management plan for each property in the Open Space inventory. The TC can then approve the plan or direct it to be changed. At prior meetings some TC members thought maintenance of Open Space properties was being short changed and wanted to direct a specific amount of the OS budget for maintenance. Other TC members objected saying that in the short run maximum funds should be used for property acquisition. These changes appear to be a compromise - no defined amount for maintenance, but the TC will oversee the OS Committee's maintenance plan.

ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION

Recycling will be a featured discussion at the June 5th Environmental Commission meeting held at 7:30pm. Liz Sweedy, the District Recycling Coordinator from Morris County Utilities Authority, will discuss the current challenges in managing the recycling stream and how this impacts Harding and surrounding communities.

At the May 1st Environmental Commission, the following items were discussed:

The Annual Roadside clean-up was a great success again this year. Many thanks to the many volunteers who helped to pick up our beautiful towns roadsides. Special thanks also goes to the DPW for their help in set up and picking up the many bags of trash that were collected.

Public comment was heard on the Township's Hunting Policy including allowing hunting on Sunday and allowing baiting during the season. The EC will finalize recommendations in June.

Living landscapes efforts continue and the EC is looking to gather additional stewardship census data on target properties this year.

<u>Commingled Recyclables</u>: Consists of all aluminum and tin cans, glass bottles, all plastic bottles and containers with the Recycling symbol, and #1, 2, 4, 5 & 7. Try to crush plastic bottle to conserve space. Please remember no plastic or paper bags.

<u>Commingled Mixed Fiber</u>: Recycling: consists of all paper, cardboard, newspaper, office paper, magazines, and books. Please put loose or shredded paper in paper bag. Please flatten all boxes or fill with other paper products. <u>Other Accepted Items</u>: Batteries; automotive (car) and household (rechargeable accepted); Automotive and light truck tires, (on or off rim), Propane tanks (BBQ size only) and fluorescent bulbs (tube and compact).

<u>E-Waste items accepted</u>: Computers, monitors, laptops and televisions <u>cannot</u> be put into household trash. However, all E-waste items including printers, copiers, fax machines and all computer peripherals can be brought to the Harding DPW recycling center at the regular hours of operation.
