2019 MEMORIAL DAY PARADE

The Harding Township Civic Association will again be sponsoring a Memorial Day Parade on May 27, 2019, stepping off from the Harding Middle School at 9:30 AM and moving east along Lee's Hill Road to Village Road and then to Memorial Park on Village Road, across from New Vernon Firehouse in recognition of all veterans, particularly those that are Harding residents.

Groups wishing to march in the parade should contact htca@mail.com and plan to assemble at the Harding Middle School on Lee's Hill Road at 9:00 AM on Parade Day.

This year we are inviting children to decorate their bicycles (helmets mandatory), wagons and scooters with colorful red, white and blue streamers and to ride in the parade in honor of our veterans.

There will be fire trucks, bands and horses and everyone is invited to march in honor of our veterans. Bring your children, your parents, your grandparents, your aunts and uncles and your pets (on a leash please) to help us celebrate our veterans on this day of remembrance.

In the event of rain, the parade will be cancelled, but the ceremony honoring our veterans will go on across the street from the Firehouse at 10 AM.

The 2019 Harding Memorial Day parade on Monday, May 27th will honor all U.S. veterans. We would like all veterans to attend and identify themselves so that

they may be recognized for their service to our Country. It is our intent to provide transportation for all veterans during the parade portion of our celebration and then ask veterans to identify themselves, the branch and unit in which they served and the dates of their service.

BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

Two items dominated the March Board of Adjustment meeting attended by many concerned and impacted residents.

Much discussion about the variances needed to develop the property at 34 Hunter Road ensued and will continue at the April meeting. Steep slopes, erosion and neighbors' privacy are major concerns, as well as increasing the building envelope from 67X25 feet to 100X100 feet.

New information unfolded regarding the cell tower project when Verizon's representative disclosed that cell tower coverage is now being researched in five alternative locations to the present proposed site - the alternative locations are Christ the King, the Fire House, New Vernon Presbyterian Church, Harding Township School and the Municipal Building. Further information will be presented at the April Board of Adjustment meeting which is held on the third Thursday of the month.

ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION

Public Feedback on Hunting Policy

At the May 1st meeting, the Environmental Commission will be seeking feedback from hunters and town residents on the Township Hunting Policy. The Environmental Commission is seeking feedback on the policy and may recommend changes prior to the start of hunting season in September. The meeting will start at 7:30pm at Town Hall.

At the April 3rd Environmental Commission meeting the following matters were addressed:

- **Annual Roadside Cleanup** will be held on Saturday, April 13th starting at

9am. Residents are encouraged to take part in picking up the roadside now that winter is over.

- **Rolling Knolls Landfill.** The Community Advisory Group will meet at Kemmerer Library on April 11th at 6pm. The landfill is located off Britten Road in Chatham Township and the EPA is preparing a remediation plan to address toxic waste found at the site.
- **Recycling** of many types of plastic is getting increasingly difficult as traditional users of recycled materials are severely limiting the types of plastics they are willing to take. The Environmental Commission will host an evening discussion on the recycling issues and options. The June 5th EC meeting is being targeted for this event. Further details will follow next month.

NEW VERNON FIRST AID SQUAD

Bicycle Safety - The rural setting of Harding and the nice weather attracts cyclists to our roads, particularly on weekends. Our narrow roads put vehicles and cyclists in close proximity with each other. Both must share the road.

Cyclists should always ride on the right side of the road, ride in single file and always wear a properly fitting helmet. Remember -- most cycling accidents are "bike on bike", not "bike on car". Don't follow other cyclists too closely. The greatest hazard of cycling is other cyclists.

Safety Tip: *Helmets Save Lives!*

Motorists should always pass cyclists safely, slowly and give a wide berth when passing. Motorists should use extreme caution and patience when encountering large groups of cyclists.

There is an excellent website, *BicycleSafe.com*, which gives good advice to motorists and cyclists citing 10 ways of "How to Not Get Hit by a Car."

HARDING TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Harding Township Police Department STRONGLY ENCOURAGES all residents and Harding businesses to sign up for emergency alert notifications at alertharding.com. The system used, Smart911, sends alerts via text, email, and/or phone for emergency notifications. In comparison to the number of residents and businesses in Harding, the number of registered users is relatively low. This system is extremely important and is used to notify you about threats to health and/or safety that may affect your home or workplace. Examples of notifications are the following: police activity, utility problems, road closures, flooding, and events that may require you to act to protect yourselves, your family or co-workers.

Harding Township Police is also on social media via Instagram, Facebook, and Twitter. However, not all alerts and important information are posted on social media. Social media is great to catch up on Harding Township Police activity and community events but should not be in lieu of the AlertHarding system.
