STATEMENT BY MAYOR CHRIS YATES

Statement by Mayor Chris Yates at Township Re-Organization Meeting

Thank you for coming tonight as we participate in one of the great activities of our local democracy.

I would like to begin by thanking my TC colleagues for their hard work and commitment to Harding. Last year was a grueling year as we worked to meet the obligations in our affordable housing settlement, particularly with regard to the redevelopment of the Hurstmont site, approved the sale of The Farm, amended our open space ordinance to shift some focus to stewardship of our lands, passed ordinances to protect Harding from reckless action on the state's part with regard to marijuana legalization, completed the new DPW building, completed the property tax revaluation, and implemented the restructuring of the police department, among others things. All of these things required significant work by the TC and town employees. Thank you to everyone.

Our volunteers, as they do every year, stepped up and did the hard work required to protect our town and keep the Harding we love. All of our boards and committees worked hard to carry out their missions. The advisory committee for the Hurstmont redevelopment did exceptional work in shaping the outcome of the development on that site and ensuring that it will be a positive impact on Harding. Everyone in town should thank them when they see them.

Special thanks go to our administrator Bob Falzarano. I like to say that not only has he seen everything that comes around- he's seen it twice. We are lucky to have him at the helm as we navigate through these choppy waters.

So what's ahead in 2020? We received an extension to complete the developer's agreement for Hurstmont and hope to complete that in the first quarter. We will complete the sale of the Farm in the first quarter. We hope to receive final approval for the diversion and disposal of Glen Alpin this year. We will negotiate a new contract with the PBA by year's end. We will introduce a budget that will keep Harding's property taxes the lowest in Morris County and the state. We will continue to work with the county and state to improve traffic conditions at the intersection of Glen Alpin/Tempe Wick and 202. Planning and discussion continue in order to protect Harding from future rounds of affordable housing. Financial planning continues to ensure Harding's financial strength is maintained and our taxes are kept low. Our objectives remain: keep taxes low and quality of life high.

Harding continues to work in what can only be described as a hostile state operating environment. Taxes, mandates, regulations, and other things coming from Trenton continue to erode the quality of life in New Jersey and prompt people to leave the state. This contributes to pressure on our real estate values and tax base and makes it harder to keep the Harding we love.

The best way to ensure Harding's future is through your civic involvement. Volunteer and offer your common sense and expertise. The generous commitment your time and wisdom is what has kept Harding thriving and will ensure our bright future. So it is with a grateful heart we thank all of you for your love of Harding and your hard work to protect its future.

TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE

Harding Township Committee Meeting - January 13, 2020

The Harding Township Committee had a very short meeting on Monday, January 13th. The meeting opened with the presentation by the Harding Township Civic Association of its Hesna Pfeiffer Award for Civic Achievement to Kim Howard for her years of volunteerism within the Community. The Committee received an update from Carol Bianchi, of JCP&L, regarding its

tree trimming program in Harding during 2020. The Committee continued its discussion from December of the Open Space Committee's Management Plans and budget for 2020 and accepted the Open Spaces Committee's budget recommendations which will be incorporated in the full Township budget as it is finalized. Finally, the Committee took up and passed the Consent Agenda, excluding the redesignation of Hurstmont Estates Acquisitions LLC as the Conditional Redeveloper of the Hurstmont site which was removed from the Consent Agenda at the meeting and deferred until the February meeting.

PROPERTY ALERT SERVICE

Protect Yourself from Mortgage Fraud: Register with "Property Alert Service"

Mortgage fraud is a rapidly growing crime where the crook tries to grab your property. To combat this, our Morris County Clerk has launched a new online service that will alert you when someone is registering a lien, changing a deed, etc. on your property.

The County Clerk (Ann Grossi) "records and maintains every conveyance of real property within the county, including deeds, mortgages, liens, subdivision maps and all other related legal documents". So this data base is the official repository of this important information. If anyone is trying to do something funny, it will have to be recorded with the County Clerk. The new service, called the Property Alert Service, will send you an email when any transaction related to your property is filed with her office. BUT YOU HAVE TO LOGON AND CREATE AN ACCOUNT. It's simple: Go to www.morriscountyclerk.org, choose "E-Services" then "Property Alert Service". The website is not as easy as Amazon, but it works and it's worth the effort.

NEW VERNON FIRST AID SQUAD

When you call 911, your call is routed to a specially trained dispatcher at the Morris County Office of Emergency Management, who, through a series of carefully selected questions, identifies the emergency, the current status of the patient(s), and dispatches all of the necessary resources including police, fire, paramedics and the First Aid Squad. While the dispatcher continues to get more information from the caller, these resources are en route to the patient. Additional information received by the dispatcher, as he continues taking information from the caller, is then passed on to in route resources by radio.

The New Vernon Volunteer First Aid Squad responds to 911 calls in Harding 24/7. Last year was no exception. The First Aid Squad responded to more than 300 calls. While most calls are for general medical emergencies, fall victims resulting in injury to the patient and motor vehicle accidents also account for a significant number of the Squad's calls. Last year, the First Aid Squad was particularly proud of its CPR save and the prompt recognition and transport of a stroke patient, which allowed for the patient's complete recovery. The First Aid Squad responded to emergencies throughout Harding, to residences, schools and businesses. During 2019, the Squad reintroduced its Hands-Only-CPR program which was

attended by more than 70 residents.

Over the past few years, the First Aid Squad has lost several members due to retirement and relocation. We are asking Harding residents to volunteer with the First Aid Squad in order to continue to provide the 24/7 level of excellent care our community has come to expect. We urgently need new EMTs and drivers. The Frist Aid Squad pays for any outside training and certification and also provides significant in-house training. The skills learned are valuable both on and off duty.
