TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE

Teleconference Township Committee Meeting April 13, 2020

The TC held its regular April meeting by telephone. The public was able to call in, listen and ask questions.

The budget for 2020 got unanimous final approved. With negligible changes, the budget was as we reported on in prior months. And we were assured that budget was reviewed in light of the CV19.

An unnamed patrol officer tendered his resignation on the same day as the TC meeting and the TC voted to accept that resignation effective immediately. This was unusual in our experience.

Two ordinances related to the Hurstmont Redevelopment got their first reading. Both were regarding the financial aspects of the transaction and particularly property taxes that the development will pay. The ordinances' first readings were approved in a 3 to 5 vote. Committee persons DiTosto and Modi both voted against the ordinances. A member of the public asked if Ms. DiTosto and Mr. Modi could explain their objections.

But according to rules, no discussion of the ordinance is allowed at the first reading. The answer was deferred to the May TC meeting where the full contract with the developer will be subject to public hearing and discussion before the final vote.

The Board met on April 2nd by special teleconference to approve the written resolutions for the following applications:

1. Application PB#02-19, Mark Rolland & Kevin Roberts, 33 Long Hill Road, Block 17, Lot 41.01. Grant of conditional use and minor site plan approval for accessory apartment and approval of bulk variances for renovation/enlarged residence.
2. Application PB#01-20, Thomas Calcagni, 24 Miller Road. Special Flood Hazard Permit.

The meeting scheduled in March was cancelled.

HARDING TOWNSHIP RECYCLING

During the ongoing State of Emergency declared by Governor Murphy, operations at the DPW have curtailed.

Hours of Operation:

Mondays & Wednesdays: 7 am - Noon

From 7am to 8am is senior (residents 60+) recycling only. Full assistance will be provided to seniors during this period.

From 8 am until noon, recycling for all residents. No assistance will be provided during these hours.

Social distancing must be observed at all times.

Commingled Recyclables: Consists of all aluminum and tin cans, glass bottles, all plastic bottles and containers with the Recycling symbol, and #1, 2, 4, 5 & 7. Try to crush plastic bottle to conserve space. Please remember no plastic or paper bags.

Commingled Mixed Fiber: Recycling: consists of all paper, cardboard, newspaper, office paper, magazines, and books. Please put loose or shredded paper in paper bag. Please flatten all boxes or fill with other paper products.

Other Accepted Items: Batteries; automotive (car) and household (rechargeable accepted); Automotive and light truck tires, (on or off rim), Propane tanks (BBQ size only) and fluorescent bulbs (tube and compact).

E-Waste items accepted: Computers, monitors, laptops and televisions cannot be put into household trash. However, all E-waste items including printers, copiers, fax machines and all computer peripherals can be brought to the Harding DPW recycling center at the regular hours of operation.
