#### **HESNA PFEIFFER AWARD**

Seeking Nominations for the Hesna Pfeiffer Award for Civic Engagement

For many years the Harding Township Civic Association awarded its Distinguished Citizen Award to an individual or group that demonstrated significant civic engagement and volunteerism. In 2014, the award was given posthumously to Hesna Pfeiffer a thoroughly engaged citizen of Harding Township for her 15 plus years of service as the editor of the Thumbnail, the publication of the Civic Association.

Also in 2014, the Civic Association renamed the award in her honor -- The Hesna Pfeiffer Award for Civic Engagement. In making the selection in the past, the trustees have often looked at a citizen's contributions over many years or even a lifetime. In the future the trustees will consider more recent efforts and hope that this will also encourage younger citizens and our youth to get and stay involved with our community.

## **TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE**

Township Committee Meeting: Menorah, Sand Spring Rd Speed Limit, and Old Library Room.

Three "discussion items" received the most focus at the October 19 TC meeting.

First, recall that at a prior meeting a rabbi asked if his community could place a menorah on Harding public grounds. He was eloquent in stating that the menorah is a symbol of light and understanding in a world that needs both. He also said that many towns in NJ allow this, and that it was a reasonable request given that Harding decorates an evergreen tree in Bayne Park during the holiday season.

At the October meeting, the TC decided against allowing the menorah, and that any religious symbols such as an angel or star on the top of the tree would not be used in 2020. The thinking seemed to be that to prevent a proliferation of religious artifacts and, to be fair to all, no religious symbols would be allowed to be displayed on Harding public property.

Second, there was a lively discussion about dropping the speed limit on Sand Spring Road. Committeeman Dev Modi ticked off a list of criteria that are used to justify cutting the speed limit -- no shoulders, many entry points, presence of walkers and joggers, etc. Public commentary was 100% in favor of reducing the speed limit. Consensus was that an ordinance to cut the speed limit would be drafted and read at the November meeting.

The third item was a plan to convert the room in Kirby Hall that housed the library before the Kemmerer Library was built to an interview room for the HT Police Department. The HTPD currently uses a room in the basement of Kirby for interviews, but that space is needed for a locker room for the new/first female police officer. Committeeman Nic Platt said that space is one of the few spaces for public meeting, and he suggested that before the old library room is given over to the use by the police, an architect should be hired to study the overall needs of the Police and the Township. Essentially a compromise was reached. As a stop gap, a door would be created from the Police Department into the old library and the room could still be available for other meetings. An architect would also be engaged to study the building and current and future space needs.

#### **HEALTH DEPARTMENT**

The Harding Township and Morris Township Health Departments will hold a Rabies Clinic for cats and dogs on Saturday, November 7, 2020, from 9 am to 11 am at the New Vernon Volunteer Fire Department located at 22 Village Road, Harding Township, New Vernon, NJ 07976. Due to COVID-19, we will ask that everyone remain in their car and a representative from the Health Departments will approach your vehicle so that paperwork can be completed. All cats are to be in a carrier and all dogs must be on a leash. Masks are mandatory to enter into the Fire Department. Further explanation of details will be provided the day of the rabies clinic.

## THE RAPTOR TRUST

The Raptor Trust is a 501 (c)(3) not for profit organization located in Millington on White Bridge Road, bordering the Great Swamp National Wildlife Refuge. We are home to approximately 50 resident birds, an on-site medical and rehabilitation center and education center.

The Raptor Trust has a virtual program option for everyone. Learn more and sign up at our website www.theraptortrust.org/education/programs.

Raptor Conference Calls: 20 minutes with a Raptor Trust educator and one of our ambassador birds. \$30 (2 screens/households permitted)

Small Group Programs: 35-40 minutes with a Raptor Trust educator and one of our ambassador birds. \$60 (Groups of 3-15 participants)

Large Group Adult Programs: 40-45 minutes with a Raptor Trust educator and one of our ambassador birds. \$80 (Up to 50 participants)

Teacher-Moderated Class Programs: (\$80) An approximately 45 minute program led by a Raptor Trust educator and moderated by the class teacher. 25 minute lesson, 10 minute live bird introduction, 10 minutes for Q&A. Choose from a variety lesson plans that can be integrated into your existing science curriculum. (maximum 35 students & 2 teachers) Full lesson plans and supportive worksheets included with purchase.

The Raptor Trust is now offering access to our outdoor aviary trail for timed tours by appointment.

**Self-guided tours by appointment:** Walk along a single direction, clearly plotted course, at your own pace, to view some of the many hawks, owls, eagles, falcons, and vultures that call NJ home. Reservations are currently being offered every 30

minutes between 1:00pm and 3:30pm on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. These private reservations are free of charge and allow you to bring a party of up to 8 people total. Masks are required.

**Staff-guided tours by appointment:** Join one of our staff educators for a guided tour of The Raptor Trust's outdoor aviary trail. Learn about our mission and history, visit with many of our resident raptors (hawks, owls, eagles, falcons and more!) and learn how their journeys brought them to The Raptor Trust. Reservations are currently being offered on Saturdays only, between 10am and 3pm. These private reservations are a flat rate of \$60 for up to 8 guests. Tours last approximately 40 minutes. Masks are required.

## FIRST AID SQUAD

We're coming into the flu season. If you haven't already done so, it's time to start thinking about getting your flu shot for the 2020-2021 flu season. This year the flu season is expected to be particularly harsh. While the flu shot will not protect you from COVID-19, catching the flu will adversely impact your immune system, perhaps reducing your ability to fight off other contagions, including COVID-19. This year, there are two strengths of the flu shot available one for seniors, 65 and older, and one for younger residents. Doctors recommend that residents 65 and over get the high dose flu shot for seniors. It is four times more potent than the standard version of the flu shot.

Flu shots are available at your doctor's office, at clinics and some local pharmacies. Appointments are not generally required at pharmacy locations carrying the flu vaccine. The supply of vaccines available is not unlimited and we recommend you get your shot early, while they are available. Older patients might also want to speak to their doctors about the pneumonia vaccine and the shingles vaccine.

While you are thinking of health-related issues, the First Aid Squad hopes you will consider volunteering for the New Vernon First Aid Squad. We continue to need EMTs and drivers to fill out our ranks so that we can continue to provide the 24/7 coverage that Harding residents have always enjoyed. #### HARDING TOWNSHIP RECYCLING

During the ongoing State of Emergency declared by Governor Murphy, operations at the DPW have curtailed.

**Hours of Operation:** 

Mondays & Wednesdays:

7 am - Noon

From 7am to 8am is senior (residents 60+) recycling only. Full assistance will be provided to seniors during this period.

From 8 am until noon, recycling for all residents. No assistance will be provided during these hours.

Social distancing must be observed at all times.

<u>Commingled Recyclables</u>: Consists of all aluminum and tin cans, glass bottles, all plastic bottles and containers with the Recycling symbol, and #1, 2, 4, 5 & 7. Try to crush plastic bottle to conserve space. Please remember no plastic or paper bags. <u>Commingled Mixed Fiber:</u> Recycling: consists of all paper, cardboard, newspaper, office paper, magazines, and books. Please put loose or shredded paper in paper bag. Please flatten all boxes or fill with other paper products.

<u>Other Accepted Items</u>: Batteries; automotive (car) and household (rechargeable accepted); Automotive and light truck tires, (on or off rim), Propane tanks (BBQ size only) and fluorescent bulbs (tube and compact).

<u>E-Waste items accepted</u>: Computers, monitors, laptops and televisions <u>cannot</u> be put into household trash. However, all E-waste items including printers, copiers, fax machines and all computer peripherals can be brought to the Harding DPW recycling center at the regular hours of operation.
