MEET THE CANDIDATES

The annual HTCA Meet the Candidates Night will be Monday, Oct. 5, 2020, starting promptly at 7:30 PM. Because of the rules governing large groups, this year's Meet the Candidates Night will be conducted as a Zoom Webinar hosted by the Kemmerer Library and conducted by the Harding Township Civic Association. This year 4 residents are running for election to the Township Committee to fill two vacancies. Chris Yates and Rita Chipperson are the Republican candidates and Amanda Richardson and Kate Barry are the Democratic candidates.

To pose a question to the Candidates send your questions before the event to htca@mail.com with the subject matter DEBATE. It is important that we receive your input/questions before the event so that we can cover as many of the issues as residents wish to hear about.

SPECIAL VOTER ALERT:

The election will be conducted primarily via the mail per Governor Murphy's executive order. You will not be permitted to vote on a machine on Election Day.*

You will receive a ballot in the mail. This is NOT sample ballot! It is your ballot. Follow the instructions for filling it out.

You can return your ballot in three different ways:

- 1) PLACE your ballot in one of several secure drop boxes that will be located throughout the county. There is a drop box behind the public safety building in Madison at 62 Kings Road and another at the Morris County Admin and Records Building, 10 Court St in Morristown.
- 2) HAND DELIVER your mail-in ballot to the Harding municipal building on Election Day or to your County Board of Elections in Morristown prior to Election Day.
- 3) RETURN your mail-in ballot via regular mail through the US Postal Service. Your return envelope will be postage paid. Mail your ballot early.

Finally you may CAST your vote in-person via paper provisional ballot at the municipal building where you normally vote on Election Day. You will vote on a provisional ballot, not on a machine.*

TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE

First Female Police Officer: On September 16, Rachael Kunz, Harding's first female police officer, will begin service at a salary of \$45,219. She is a graduate of Cape May County police academy.

"Good Audit Report:" Harding's auditor reported to the township committee that controls are in place and the financial statements accurately portray the state of Harding's financial conditions. The auditor said that the financial staff does a "great job." Further debt capacity was pegged at \$78mm against just \$5mm outstanding.

Lots of Unsafe Residential Generators? Because of the frequent power outages caused by the storms taking down trees, many residents have their own generators. It is suspected that many were installed without permits and inspections. These could be unsafe due to "backflow" of power from a home to the grid or even to neighboring homes caused by improper transfer switches. The idea was floated that HT has a correction period to get generators inspected. Under this proposal, no fine will be assessed but after correction period a "hefty fine" would be levied. Publicity will be needed to inform homeowners. This program is still being crafted.

Dickson's Mill Road Bridge Replacement - Controversy

The design of proposed replacement bridge has heated up again. In 1980, the current 20ft wide bridge was installed. The county has determined that the bridge needs replacement, but they use a one-size-fits-all 26 ft. wide design. Area residents and others are concerned that Dickson's Mill Road will be straightened and eventually widened creating more and speedier traffic. Approximately 10 residents voiced strong opposition to the County's design. In contrast to a few months ago, it now appears that all TC members are against the 26 ft. wide bridge. The struggle to have a

narrower bridge will continue. Nic Platt and Tim Jones, of the HT infrastructure sub-committee will work with the County to come to a resolution. Interestingly, testimony presented regarding new regulations from the State, the ultimate source of funding, relaxed the rules about bridge width. The hope is when the County is made aware of these new standards, it will agree to design a 20ft wide structure. With the mayor and full TC behind the 20ft width, Harding should get what the bridge residents want.

New Open Space Purchase - 163 Lees Hill Road: A plan to purchase the 5 acre property adjacent to the Great Swamp was introduced. The property would be purchased with money from the Harding Open Space Trust (aka HOST). HOST is funded with a direct tax on property in Harding. This proposed acquisition will be discussed at the October TC meeting.

No Left Turn onto Blue Mill from Dicksons Mill Road: At the very end of the meeting, Mayor Yates asked the township administrator to investigate the ramifications of preventing a left turn onto Blue Mill Road from Dicksons Mill Road. He cited safety reasons.

PLANNING BOARD

Planning Board Notes for August 24, 2020

The Planning Board continued to discuss Application PB# 02-20 which was for a three-lot subdivision with variances for front setbacks and accessory structures at 579 Van Beuren Road. The Applicant presented a revised plan. In the original plan the three lots were divided by straight lines, which produced aesthetically shaped lots but also generated the non-conforming issues for Lot 5 in the back. In the revised plan, the lot line between Lots 5 and 5.01 was redrawn so that Lot 5 now has a more of a hexagonal shape than a square. The result, however, produces a plan that is totally conforming and requires no variances or changes to access. The Board adopted a resolution approving the application.

The Chairman reminded the members of several issues that the Board could work on. These included the use of setbacks rather than floor area ratio to control bulk, the Harding Green deck repair issue, whether ordinances support working from home, placement of swing sets and play sets, and whether the B2 zone needed to be reworked. He also called the Board's attention to its recently released budget for 2021, which in its current state resembles the 2020 budget.

During these unprecedented times, the First Aid Squad continues to need volunteers to be able to provide 24/7 First Aid service to Harding. We have seen many expressions of support from the Community, including the generous sharing with us of your personal protective equipment which we needed to perform our job. In addition, we have received cards and letters expressing gratitude to the First Aid

Squad, but this letter particularly touched our hearts.

"Dear First Aid Squad,

My husband, I and our two daughters want to express our sincere gratitude for the outstanding service that your team provided on the morning of June 25, 2020.

The night before my husband developed symptoms of a kidney stone that was large enough to block the flow from one of his kidneys. A few hours later I sensed that he was becoming delirious and confused. I called your organization for assistance in transporting him to the Morristown Memorial ER. Your response was excellent and your team's diagnosis helped us understand the seriousness of his condition.

The stone blockage started an infection that progressed to Sepsis. The situation was so serious that the ER doctors told me to prepare for the worst. After three days on a ventilator (and lots of prayers) my husband made a remarkable recovery. As you well know, a rapid response and mitigation is what saves lives. And that is exactly what your team did — saving my husband's life!

We are eternally grateful to the professionalism of your organization. And, as longtime supporters of NVVFAS, we would like to express our heartful appreciation."

The First Aid Squad hopes you never need to call 911 for any emergency including a medical emergency, but please know that if you do we will be there for you 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Please consider volunteering as a driver or EMT. We are Neighbors Helping Neighbors.

HARDING TOWNSHIP RECYCLING

During the ongoing State of Emergency declared by Governor Murphy, operations at the DPW have curtailed.

Hours of Operation:

Mondays & Wednesdays:

7 am - Noon

From 7am to 8am is senior (residents 60+) recycling only. Full assistance will be provided to seniors during this period.

From 8 am until noon, recycling for all residents. No assistance will be provided during these hours.

Social distancing must be observed at all times.

<u>Commingled Recyclables</u>: Consists of all aluminum and tin cans, glass bottles, all plastic bottles and containers with the Recycling symbol, and #1, 2, 4, 5 & 7. Try to crush plastic bottle to conserve space. Please remember no plastic or paper bags.

<u>Commingled Mixed Fiber:</u> Recycling: consists of all paper, cardboard, newspaper, office paper, magazines, and books. Please put loose or shredded paper in paper bag. Please flatten all boxes or fill with other paper products.

<u>Other Accepted Items</u>: Batteries; automotive (car) and household (rechargeable accepted); Automotive and light truck tires, (on or off rim), Propane tanks (BBQ size only) and fluorescent bulbs (tube and compact).

<u>E-Waste items accepted</u>: Computers, monitors, laptops and televisions <u>cannot</u> be put

into household trash. However, all E-waste items including printers, copiers, fax machines and all computer peripherals can be brought to the Harding DPW recycling center at the regular hours of operation.
