### TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE

Township Committee November Meeting - 100 Year Old Resident, Roads, Tunis Ellis House, Menorah

**Walter Ness Turns 100 on November 24:** By the time you read this, Walter Ness, a 63 year resident of Harding, will be 100. A WW2 Navy vet, Mr. Ness was involved in many town activities and organizations - Presbyterian Church, Cub Scouts, American Legion, VFW, Harding Seniors, and many others -- while working for 34 years at Bell Labs. The Committee recognized Mr. Ness for his community spirit, dedication to Harding and heart health awareness.

**Road Safety**: Safety on two Harding roads was discussed. First, Dr. D'Urso, resident of a home on the dogleg of Kitchell Road, asked if the town could install a street light so cars coming from Woodland Ave. towards Spring Valley Rd. know that the tight turn is ahead. Dr D'Urso said that cars have missed the turn and ended on his front lawn. He believes there was a light but it might have been removed in a carbon emission reduction move. Nic Platt volunteered to look into the problem.

Second, an ordinance to drop the speed limit on Sand Spring Road speed limit from 35 to 25 mph was discussed. Some members of the public pushed back on the speed limit reduction. Residents of the road were for the reduction. Landscaper rigs were cited as a major problem, but it was noted that there is no ordinance against these. Schemes to make the reduction on just a part of Sand Spring and install warning signs were brought up. Speed limits cannot be changed without an engineering study. The study to drop the limit on the entire road has been completed while a study for a partial reduction would have to be done.

**Tunis Ellis House:** The Tunis Ellis house is the 1795 structure at the corner of Village and Millbrook roads. Significant deterioration has been revealed by a \$10K study of the building. About \$68K of work on the foundation is needed immediately and a total of \$200K is required over the long term. The all-volunteer Harding Historical Society is asking for help from Township engineer Paul Fox to review the bids. The funds for the work would be raised from private sources and Morris County.

**Support for Menorah Voiced:** After the township passed a resolution on Township employee salary resolutions, the TC allowed comments from the public. Approximately 6 members of the public voiced support to permit the placement of a menorah on public property, in the spirit of inclusiveness. Recall that two months ago, a rabbi made the original request for the menorah -- a symbol of light and understanding. At last month's TC meeting, the TC decided not to allow the menorah and to be even-handed to remove any religious symbols (ex. angel) from the Christmas tree at Bayne Park and inside Kirby Hall. One of the commenters cited a 1989 Supreme Court ruling that a menorah is not a religious symbol. The members of the public who commented all supported the menorah and asked the TC to reconsider its decision.

Meeting was adjourned.

### HARDING TOWNSHIP RECYCLING

During the ongoing State of Emergency declared by Governor Murphy, operations at the DPW have curtailed.

Hours of Operation:

Mondays & Wednesdays:

7 am - Noon

From 7am to 8am is senior (residents 60+) recycling only. Full assistance will be provided to seniors during this period.

From 8 am until noon, recycling for all residents. No assistance will be provided during these hours.

### Social distancing must be observed at all times.

<u>Commingled Recyclables</u>: Consists of all aluminum and tin cans, glass bottles, all plastic bottles and containers with the Recycling symbol, and #1, 2, 4, 5 & 7. Try to crush plastic bottle to conserve space. Please remember no plastic or paper bags. <u>Commingled Mixed Fiber</u>: Recycling: consists of all paper, cardboard, newspaper, office paper, magazines, and books. Please put loose or shredded paper in paper bag. Please flatten all boxes or fill with other paper products.

<u>Other Accepted Items</u>: Batteries; automotive (car) and household (rechargeable accepted); Automotive and light truck tires, (on or off rim), Propane tanks (BBQ size only) and fluorescent bulbs (tube and compact).

<u>E-Waste items accepted</u>: Computers, monitors, laptops and televisions <u>cannot</u> be put into household trash. However, all E-waste items including printers, copiers, fax machines and all computer peripherals can be brought to the Harding DPW recycling center at the regular hours of operation.
