PLATT WINS DICKSON'S MILL BRIDGE FIGHT

It may have appeared quixotic at the start, but Township Committee person, Nic Platt won the fight on behalf of residents and other supporters to have the replacement bridge on Dickson's Mill Road be only 22 feet wide. Morris County said it had to be 26 feet wide to get State funding. The bridge is in need of replacement as the foundations have been eroded by the stream that it crosses.

Residents were concerned that a wide 26 ft bridge would increase traffic speeds and increase traffic flow, which would lead to widening of the road thereby destroying the rural character of that area.

Nic Platt originally took the fight to Morris County which said the only way to get a narrow bridge was for Harding to pay for the entire project as the State required a standard size to get State funding. Platt then took the problem to the State DOT Commissioner. A turning point was Platt's September letter to the Commissioner which highlighted new American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials guidelines on "low volume bridges" to the Commissioner's attention.

Finally after a year of calls, letters, meetings and threat of a sit in (and strapping himself to the bridge), Mr Platt succeeded. The Commissioner, in a December 9 letter, agreed to a 22 ft wide bridge, slightly wider than the current bridge, but narrower than the supposed standard 26 feet.

FIRST AID SQUAD

This month, the Belmar First Aid Squad, the nation's oldest volunteer First Aid Squad, founded in 1928, announced it would be closing on March 31, 2021. Can it happen in Harding? You bet it could!

The Belmar First Aid Squad was an all-volunteer agency until 2018 when it became a paid service because it couldn't find the volunteers it needed to continue to provide a 24/7 service. The switch to a paid service created a different set of problems, involving staffing, finance, and administration issues. Many small first aid squads, like the New Vernon Volunteer First Aid Squad, are finding it more and more difficult to attract the staff necessary to carry on providing a 24/7 service. Government regulations require that on each call that the ambulance be staffed with at least 2 EMTs. New Vernon Volunteer First Aid Squad operates 10 shifts a week, plus all members do 'scrambles' on the weekend.

Kevin Murphy, the Squad Captain, advises that we are currently covering our shifts, but there is little or no give if members get sick or want to go on vacation, or take time off for other personal or family reasons. Currently, we have two EMT members on long term disability right now, only one of which is likely to be coming back. Also, there is a constant need to replace members who age out or simply relocate from Harding. The Covid-19 pandemic has caused further stress on the Squad's resources.

Larry Weppler, the Squad's President and former Recruitment Officer, said the need is critical. Even if we get people signed up now, it takes time for these new members to get qualified and get certified as EMTs.

2021 Recycling Schedule:

February 13th, 27th May 8th, 22nd

March 13th, 27th April 10th, 24th

Hours of Operation:

Mondays & Wednesdays: 7 am - Noon

Saturdays: 9 am - Noon

From 7am to 8am is senior (residents 60+) recycling only. Full assistance will be provided to seniors during this period.

From 8 am until noon, recycling for all residents. No assistance will be provided during these hours.

Social distancing must be observed at all times.

<u>Commingled Recyclables</u>: Consists of all aluminum and tin cans, glass bottles, all plastic bottles and containers with the Recycling symbol, and #1, 2, 4, 5 & 7. Try to crush plastic bottle to conserve space. Please remember no plastic or paper bags.

<u>Commingled Mixed Fiber:</u> Recycling: consists of all paper, cardboard, newspaper, office paper, magazines, and books. Please put loose or shredded paper in paper bag. Please flatten all boxes or fill with other paper products.

<u>Other Accepted Items</u>: Batteries; automotive (car) and household (rechargeable accepted); Automotive and light truck tires, (on or off rim), Propane tanks (BBQ size only) and fluorescent bulbs (tube and compact).

<u>E-Waste items accepted</u>: Computers, monitors, laptops and televisions <u>cannot</u> be put into household trash. However, all E-waste items including printers, copiers, fax machines and all computer peripherals can be brought to the Harding DPW recycling center at the regular hours of operation.
