HARDING TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE

Township Committee - Historic House, Library, DPW, Bullseye!

Historic House of the Year – 24 Lee's Hill Road. This circa 1825 home, owned by Kristen Peterson, was recognized by the Preservation Commission and the Harding TC by resolution which praised the "fantastic job of maintaining the modest integrity of the house, garage and small barn...with the use of period correct details...properly scaled materials and windows and modest additions that supplement the original scale, massing and architectural details of the farmhouse".

Annual Library Report. Margie Ticknor, the new library director, presented the annual report to the TC regarding the activities of the Kemmerer Library and community center. Ms. Ticknor was a VP of marketing at Loreal and acquired an MS degree in library science. Her report highlighted the expanded programming and the value that Harding gets from the Morris Area Information Network, a book sharing scheme. The Library receives just \$40K from the township, unchanged in at least 10 years, while the rest of the nearly \$200K budget (as well as the original construction cost) is raised directly from residents.

Dept of Public Works Report. Tracy Toribio, department head, delivered his annual report on the DPW. He reviewed the scope of the job in terms of number of miles of roads (30 miles and 3mm sq ft of asphalt), catch basins (461), cross over pipes (243), street signs (500), etc. Toribio showed data on the road conditions (as per the Asphalt Institute Rating System) that revealed that 64% of our roads are in "good to excellent" condition and 36% are rated "fair to good". None is in poor condition. He showed the 2022 roadwork schedule with the major project being milling and repaving of the entire length of Pleasantville Rd. The DPW has 9 employees and operates on a \$636K budget (before salaries). The budget buys fuel, salt, etc).

Old Library Room Converting to Police Dept Use. A very long discussion ensued regarding the plan to convert the old library room in Kirby Hall for interview space

by the PD. Committee person Nic Platt was concerned that a meeting space for boards, committees and commissions was now unavailable, and that the public was not involved or informed of the decision. After almost an hour, the discussion ended with a resolution to allow the township executive to proceed with the plans.

Bulls Eye Mirror Donation Acknowledged. The special mirror above the dais in the large room in Kirby Hall has been re-gilded at no cost to Harding taxpayers. The original work was of inferior quality (not real gold leaf!) and tarnished/oxidized over the few years since the redecorating. Harding resident Frank Pollaro, owner of Pollaro Custom Furniture and a resident, donated his firm's services to re-gild the mirror with 24c gold leaf...a job that was quoted by another firm at \$14K. Recall that Pollaro also donated the Chippendale tables in the same room. Thank you, Frank Pollaro.

VFW

VFW in Harding? Yes, many years ago for a brief time there was a Veterans of Foreign Wars Post in Harding, however as the demographics changed, it merged with the Morristown Post which subsequently merged with the Watnog Post in Morris Plains. Today, there are several of us in Harding who are members of the Morris Plains Post, which now also covers Morristown, Madison, and the Chathams as well as Harding. This Post is quite active with many events throughout the year. Look for members Rich Olsen and Walter Ness in this years Memorial Day Parade for more information.

FIRST AID SQUAD

Bicycle Safety -- The rural setting of Harding and the nice weather attracts cyclists to our roads, particularly on weekends. Harding's narrow roads put vehicles and cyclists in close proximity with each other. Both must share the road.

Cyclists should always ride on the right side of the road, ride in single file and always wear a properly fitting helmet. Remember -- most cycling accidents are "bike on bike," not "bike on car." Don't follow other cyclists too closely. The greatest hazard of cycling is other cyclists.

Safety Tip: Helmets Save Lives!

Motorists should always pass cyclists safely, slowly and give a wide berth when passing. New Jersey mandates that drivers passing a bicycle must allow a minimum of 4-feet. Motorists should use extreme caution and patience when encountering large groups of cyclists.

HARDING TOWNSHIP PLANNING BOARD Planning Board Notes for April 25, 2022

In one of the shortest meetings in recent memory, the Board approved the written resolution approving Application PB# 01-22 submitted by the Pacchianos at 23 Ravenswood Lane who were seeking an amendment to a prior plan approval for an easement for a water main under a landscape easement. The new easement was being sought for the benefit of the Southeast Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority (SMCMUA) who is looking to (1) complete a supply loop system to Anthony Wayne Road so that the water supply could be maintained in case of a break, (2) eliminate the need for line flushing by connecting dead ends, and (3) provide additional fire protection. The meeting was then adjourned.

Every Wednesday, seniors (residents 60+) will have full assistance available to them from 7am-9am. All residents are welcome for all hours that Recycling is open. Social distancing must be observed at all times.

<u>Commingled Recyclables:</u> Consists of all aluminum and tin cans, glass bottles, all plastic bottles and containers with the recycling symbol, and #1,2,4,5 & 7. Try to crush plastic bottles to conserve space. Please remember no plastic or paper bags.

<u>Commingled Mixed Fiber:</u> Consists of all paper, cardboard, newspaper, office paper, magazines, and books. Please put loose or shredded paper in paper bag. Please flatten all boxes or fill with other paper products.

Other Accepted Items: Batteries; automotive (car) and household (rechargeable accepted); Automotive and light truck tires, (on or off rim), Propane tanks (BBQ size only) and fluorescent bulbs (tube and compact).

<u>E-Waste Items:</u> Computers, monitors, laptops, and televisions <u>cannot</u> be put in household trash. However, all E-waste items including printers, copiers, fax machines and all computer peripherals can be brought to the Harding DPW recycling center at the regular hours of operation.
