TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MEETING

We Have a New Police Chief - Lt Gromek Promoted!

At a packed Township Committee Meeting, Lt Gromek, a 9-year veteran of the Harding PD, was promoted and sworn in as Chief of the department. The rest of our department, Gromek's family, and a multitude of officers from neighboring departments attended to ceremony. Gromek has a BA from Kean University and a Master's from Seton Hall. Among other awards and citations, he is an 11-time recipient of the Mother's Against Drunk Driving Award and has two lifesaving awards. He has been acting chief since August of last year and his promotion is the result of a seven-month evaluation process and the recommendation of Robert Falzarano, Harding Administrator, and a former police officer and chief himself.

<u>Historic House of the Year 2022 – Eddy House, 48 Meyersville Road</u> The Township Committee, at the recommendation of the Harding Historic Preservation Commission, awarded the Historic House of the year to the Eddy House, currently belonging to the Douglas family. The 1 ½ story gabled structure is a "wonderful contribution to the historic character of the Meyersville wooded community". The East Jersey cottage can be seen on area maps as early as 1853 and 1868 as the home of L. Eddy, thus the name Eddy House. The homes that the Historic Preservation Commission wishes to highlight should be viewed from the road, enhance the streetscape, display proper use of scale, rhythm, massing, and materials and have an architectural style that compliments the rural character of Harding Township. Hesna Pfeiffer Award for Civic Engagement for 2022 Goes to Susan Sameth Also at the March TC meeting, Dr Louis Lanzerotti presented the annual Hesna Pfeiffer Award on behalf of the Harding Township Civic Association to Susan Sameth. Dr. Lanzerotti said that Ms. Sameth "exemplifies a life of service to Harding Township, and to a multitude of organization and people in the Harding region." A registered nurse, Sameth has been an essential member of the HT First Aid Squad serving as a lieutenant, captain, vice president and president. She and her husband have donated generously to the Morristown Medical Center and the Emergency Department, that handle 100,000 cases per year is named for them. She has served other organizations as well – Birth Haven, Newton NJ; Christ the King Parish; "backpack food program" of the Catholic Charities in Paterson. Her extensive volunteer work has been recognized formally by Christ the King parish, Tri County Scholarship Fund and Catholic Charities. The Hesna Pfeiffer Award for Civic Engagement is named for Thumbnails long time editor who was taken from us too soon several years ago. Plaques, with the names of all past awardees, are on the wall at the entrance to Kirby Hall.

<u>Residents Concerned About Crime and Car Thefts at Township Committee Meeting</u> At the March Township Committee Meeting, after the promotion and awards, the TC got down to its regular business. At the portion of the meeting where the public can speak, a group of residents from Glen Eagle Drive, a small, association owned cul de sac off Youngs Road, expressed their concern about crime – especially car thefts in broad daylight. They mentioned incidents of young people (teenager) boldly checking car doors to find unlocked vehicles to steal. The residents there have video surveillance, so they have recording. But one resident says she felt trapped in her home. A member of the Harding PD was there and agreed that there is a problem in Harding and statewide. It seems the thieves come in a stolen car and drop off 2-4 teenagers to fan out looking for nice cars that are easy to steal. There is a Morris County task force that is working with the State Police trying to get a handle on the problem. A constructive and polite discussion raised several good ideas, though given the scope of the problem, no definitive solutions other than keep your car locked and in a closed garage if possible. It was agreed that a large-scale meeting with the key police officers, township representations and of course citizens will be held (hopefully in April) to bring up issues and relate things citizens can do to protect themselves and their property.

Bicycle Safety -- The rural setting of Harding and the nice weather attracts cyclists to our roads, particularly on weekends. Harding's narrow roads put vehicles and cyclists in proximity with each other. Both must share the road.

Cyclists should always ride on the right side of the road, ride in single file and always wear a properly fitting helmet. Remember -- most cycling accidents are "bike on bike", not "bike on car". Don't follow other cyclists too closely. The greatest hazard of cycling is other cyclists. **Safety Tip:** *Helmets Save Lives!* Motorists should always pass cyclists safely, slowly and give a wide berth when passing. A New Jersey law passed in August 2021mandates that drivers passing a bicycle must allow a minimum of 4-feet. Motorists should use extreme caution and patience when encountering large groups of cyclists.

There is an excellent website, *BicycleSafe.com*, which gives good advice to motorists and cyclists citing 10 ways of "How to Not Get Hit by a Car."

Also, with more electric bikes taking to the roads, please be sure to take care with Lithium-Ion batteries. We are seeing more frequent battery related fires.

- Avoid charging your device around flammable materials, such as a bed, couch or on paper.
- Charge your device with the power cord that came with it.
- Never keep li-ion batteries near heat sources or in high temperatures or such as direct sunlight, radiators, etc.
- Properly dispose of any battery or charger that is damaged.
