#### HARDING TOWNSHIP BOARD OF EDUCATION

The Harding Township Board of Education met on Monday October 20<sup>th</sup> in the Library/Stem Lab of the Harding Middle School. The Principal/Director of Curriculum, Dr. April Friedman presented an update to the Board, and to the community, regarding the district's results on the state testing for the 2024-25 academic school year:

- 1) Harding Township School had 92% of 8<sup>th</sup> grade students and 91% of 7<sup>th</sup> grade students passed the English Language Arts test.
- 2) 100% of all test takers passed the Algebra assessment and 96% of all 4<sup>th</sup> grade students passed the mathematics assessment.
- 3) Harding Township school outperformed the state average by 41% in Math and 31% in English Language Arts.

# **Board of Education- November 10th, 2025**

The Harding Township Board of Education presented its 2024-25 audit results to the public in the Library/Stem Lab of the Harding Middle School. Mr. Andrew Lucinski, Partner, Nisovaccia, LLC presented to the Board of Education and to the public. The results of the audit indicated that Harding Township School District is in sound financial standing, and no areas requiring improvement were identified in the following audit items: Administrative Practices and Procedures, Financial Planning, Accounting, and Reporting, School Purchasing Program, School Food Service, Student Body Activities, Application for State School Aid, Pupil Transportation, Facilities and Capital Assets, Status of Prior Year's Findings/Recommendations Next Meeting: Wednesday, December 17<sup>th</sup> 7 PM- The Board will review the budget guidelines for the 2026-2027 school year.

#### **NEW VERNON GARDEN CLUB**

Lemonade

That whole "If you have lemons, make lemonade"? I embrace that. I am really lucky to have a positive mindset. It has even been helping me with my fall cleanup! I do a lot of pruning in the fall (except for the spring flowering stuff, which you have to hit two seconds after blooming finishes). Things have slowed down, I am sick to death of weeding, I can see which things have gotten a little too tall or a little out of control over the growing season and many of them have lost a lot of leaves, making the structure easier to evaluate. I think I might have mentioned this before, but it deserves a second mention: after I cut a branch, I snip it into smaller pieces (3-6 inches long, depending on how far back in the garden I am! If they can't be seen from the garden's edge, 6 inches is fine! And if there are a few really long ones, just sling them as far back as you can!) and drop them right on the ground. No clean-up, no carting away. They are mulch! Free mulch! Same for long-leaved herbaceous plants like daylilies and Siberian iris. Chop, chop, chop, drop, drop, drop, drop. My latest lemon is the gorgeous bamboo Pleioblastus viridistriatus 'Chrysophyllus' (don't even try!), which has now gamboled about 60 ft down my outer garden. There is no possible way that I can eradicate this, so I am now cutting it to the ground (really easy), chopping and dropping. Since quite a bit of this is close to the front, where it can be seen, I put a very thin layer of traditional mulch over the droppings to camouflage them! So, my lemonade? A never-ending supply of compost! Additionally, I am not tempted to try to dig up and move plants in their midst anymore, since prying their respective roots apart is not worth the time and effort, thus giving me the perfect excuse to just leave them be. After all of the chopping and dropping, the last thing I do for fall clean-up is drive around on my little John Deere,

dicing up the leaves that haven't blown away, which I then blow as far back into the garden as possible with my new Ego battery-operated blower!! Beautiful, sustainable, free! Lem.O.Nade.

#### **NEIGHBORS FOR TOMORROW IN HARDING (NFTH)**

**Neighbors for Tomorrow in Harding (NFTH)**--- It is important for residents to stay informed about Housing Development projects underway in Harding Township and the implications for our community way of life. The goal of NFTH is to communicate with residents and to advocate for transparency from our Township Committee as options are evaluated for development in our town.

The Township Committee Meeting on November 10th included several Agenda items concerning Affordable Housing. The meeting opened with a summary of Affordable Housing to date:

**Round 3 (2015–2025):** Quota  $176 \rightarrow 103$  produced/credited; 73 covered by Route 202 overlay.

**Round 4 (2025–2035):** Quota 75 → primarily covered by a 54-unit 100% affordable rental units on Kitchell Rd (Walters Capital), plus credits/bonuses. The Highlands conformance (2024) helps limit where intensive development can occur. and compliance avoids Builder's Remedy suits.

The TC approved on Monday an **AHO-2 change** adopted for 1103 & 1105 Route 202 resulting in density increase from 8 to 10 units/acre if an onsite package wastewater plant is built. The full <u>Planning Board site plan review will still be required</u>. The effect of this change is an increase from 53 units to a new cap of 65 units (+12), with full Planning Board review still ahead. It was noted that the Fair Share Housing Center was heavily involved in this statewide and it will be effective only after court approval. The <u>next Planning Board Meeting</u> is scheduled for Monday November 24th so please refer to that Agenda when it is published.

During the Public Comment period there were many public comments which focused on traffic/safety, low-yield wells & clay soils, infrastructure capacity, siting along 202, and especially transparency. A resident also objected to added density as well as the process and transparency of the Township Committee.

<u>Commingled Mixed Fiber:</u> Consists of all paper, cardboard, newspaper, office paper, magazines, and books. Please put loose or shredded paper in paper bag. Please flatten all boxes or fill with other paper products.

Other Accepted Items: Batteries; automotive (car) and household (rechargeable accepted); Automotive and light truck tires, (on or off rim), Propane tanks (BBQ size only) and fluorescent bulbs (tube and compact).
